This matter comes before the Court on the joint request of the parties for an Order (1) re-scheduling the date for the hearing on Plaintiffs' Motion for Temporary Injunction, said hearing having been set by me in the in the Temporary Restraining Order issued on Friday, November 19, 2021, to expire on Monday, November 29, 2021 and (2) extending the Temporary Restraining Order pending the hearing and determination of Plaintiff's Motion for Temporary Injunction. That hearing is presently scheduled for Monday, November 29, 2021 at 2:00 p.m. Counsel for the Defendants has requested a rescheduling of the hearing date to Day, Month, Date, 202 . Counsel for Plaintiffs has agreed to the rescheduling of the hearing, provided that the Temporary Restraining Order is extended through the new hearing date.

In light of the parties' consent, as evidenced by the signatures of their respective counsel below, I find that rescheduling of the hearing and concomitant extension of the Temporary Restraining Order are appropriate. The consent of the parties does not act as a waiver of any claims or defenses that any of the parties may have in this matter.

1. That the hearing on Plaintiffs' Motion for Temporary Injunction previously scheduled for Monday, November 29, 2021 at 2:00 p.m. is rescheduled for _____, _____, 202_, at _:__.m., date in Courtroom ____ of the Richland County Judicial Center, 1701 Main Street, Columbia, South Carolina 29201.

2. That the Temporary Restraining Order issued in this matter on Friday, November 19, 2021, originally to expire at 11:59 p.m. on Monday, November 29, 2021, shall remain in full force and effect until 11:59 p.m. of the date on which Plaintiffs' Motion for Temporary Injunction is actually heard, without need for further requests for extension.

Good Morning Ms. Elgin:

As you know, In the Temporary Restraining Order (TRO) that Judge Manning issued in the above-referenced case on Friday, November 19, 2021, the hearing on the Plaintiffs' Motion for Temporary Injunction was set for this coming Monday, November 29, 2021 at 2:00 p.m. Subsequently, counsel for Defendants, Tracy Eggleston, asked me if I would extend to her the courtesy of consenting to a brief extension of time for the hearing. I consented to such a postponement, provided that the TRO remains in effect until the Motion for Temporary Injunction is actually heard. This being agreed upon, we have jointly drafted the attached proposed consent order, with the new date of the hearing blank for now until Judge Manning designates a new date.

Ms. Eggleston has indicated that she is available on December 13 or 15 and December 20, 21, or 22.
